Electronic Prescription Service (EPS)

Roll-out to the Secure & Detained Estate







- EPS is part of an ongoing national programme of upgrades and changes aimed at ensuring equivalent care for patients within the detained estate, comparable to that provided to community patients.
 - smart card implementation, PDS matching, NHS number tracing, eReferrals, GMS and GP2GP integration.
- NECS conduct monthly SystmOne (clinical health record) audits.
- NECS collaborate with establishments to improve data quality and clinical record-keeping.
- NECS support standardisation efforts e.g. National Suit of Templates (SEAT & IRCAT)

- NECS/NHSE/EPS meet for regular project meetings
 - Identification & management of risks & issues (e.g legislation changes)
 - Testing & Bug Fixing
 - 7708418 Convert prescriptions where the quantity is set in packs to the units that are required by EPS
 - 7770965 Issue sending quantities in 000s to EPS
 - Obtain: Assurance & CSG Approval
 - Communications & Awareness (Prison TV, Prison Radio, Leaflets)
 - Working with stakeholders (NHSBSA, prisons & local pharmacies)



Exemption from charges for prisoners and persons detained in other secure accommodation

11.—(1) A prisoner or person detained in other secure accommodation is not liable to pay any charge under these Regulations.

(2) No charge is payable under regulation 3(1), 3(2), or 4 by a person where the charge is for drugs or appliances ordered on a non-electronic prescription form, and—

- (a) that person was a prisoner or a person detained in other secure accommodation at the time that the non-electronic prescription form was issued; and
- (b) that non-electronic prescription form has printed upon it-
 - (i) the letters "HMP", and
 - (ii) the name and address of the prison or other secure accommodation in which the person was detained at the time the non-electronic prescription form was issued.

The National Health Service (Charges for Drugs and Appliances) (Amendment) (No. 2) Regulations 2024

Made Laid before Parliament Coming into force31st October 2024 1st November 2024 29th November 2024

The Secretary of State for Health and Social Care makes the following Regulations in exercise of the powers conferred by sections 172, 178, 182 and 272(7) and (8)(a) of the National Health Service Act 2006(1).
