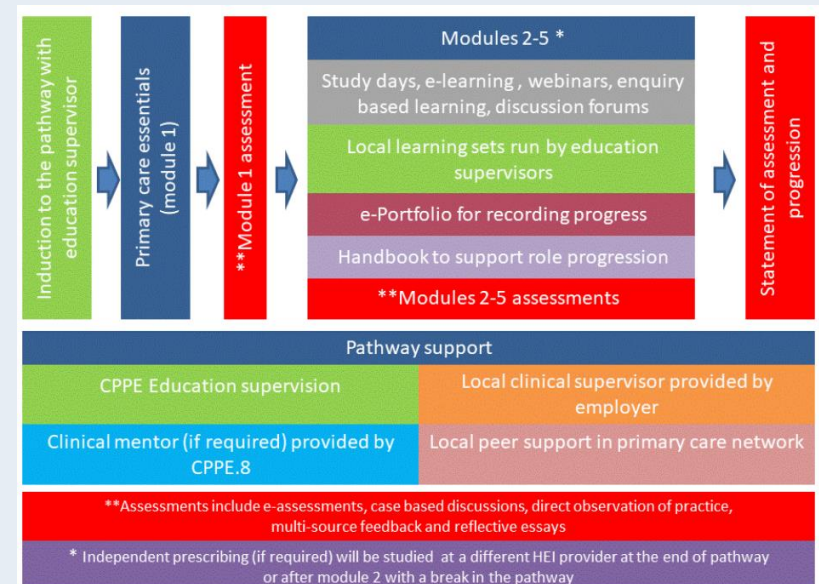

Primary care pharmacy education pathway

For pharmacists and pharmacy technicians working in GP practice, care home, Health and Justice or armed forces roles.



Why should you do PCPEP?

- This is a fully funded training offer worth over £5000 for pharmacists and over £4000 for pharmacy technicians.
- General practice and care home roles are relatively new and very different to working in other sectors.
- It will prepare pharmacists to go on to train to be prescribers (if they are not already IPs)

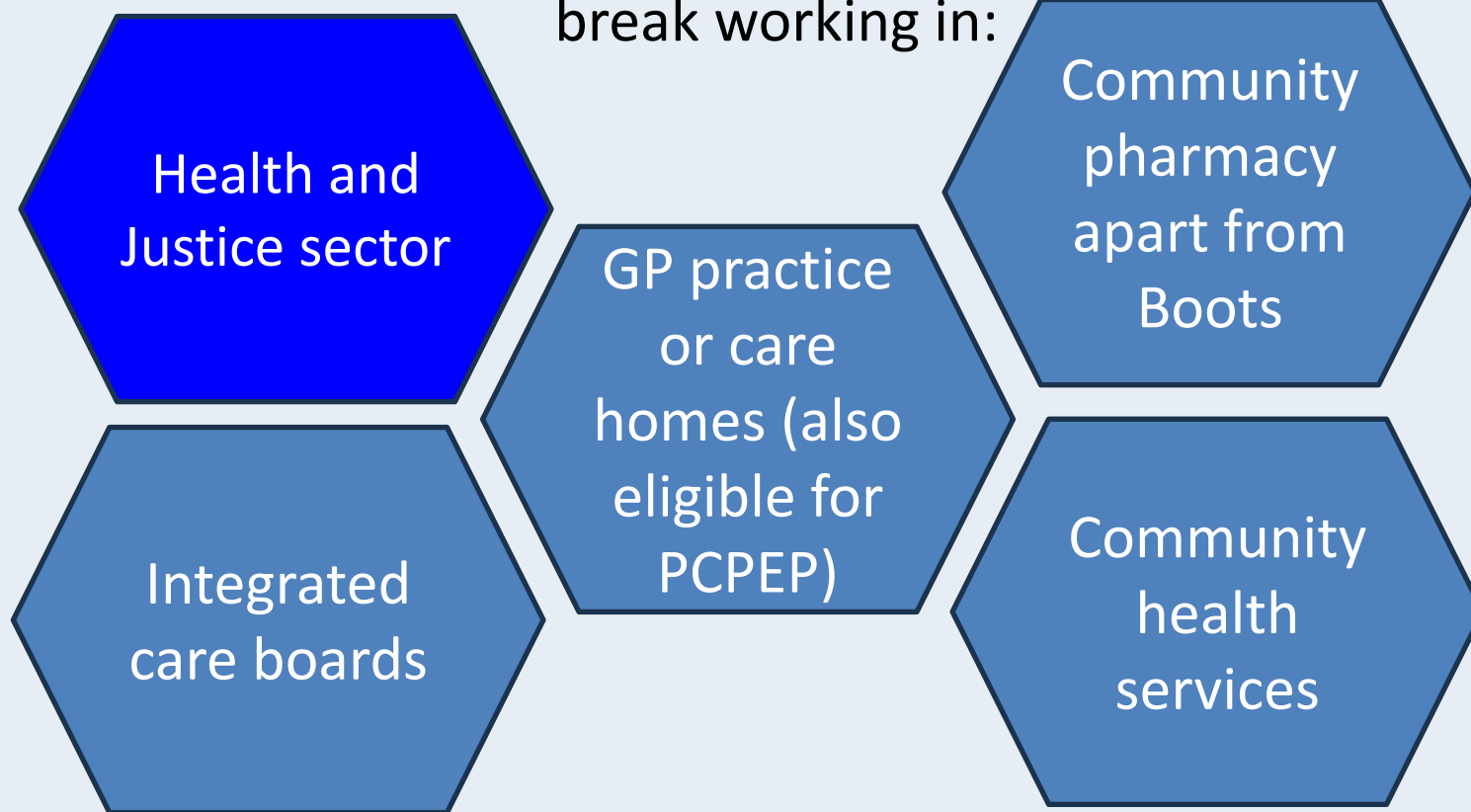

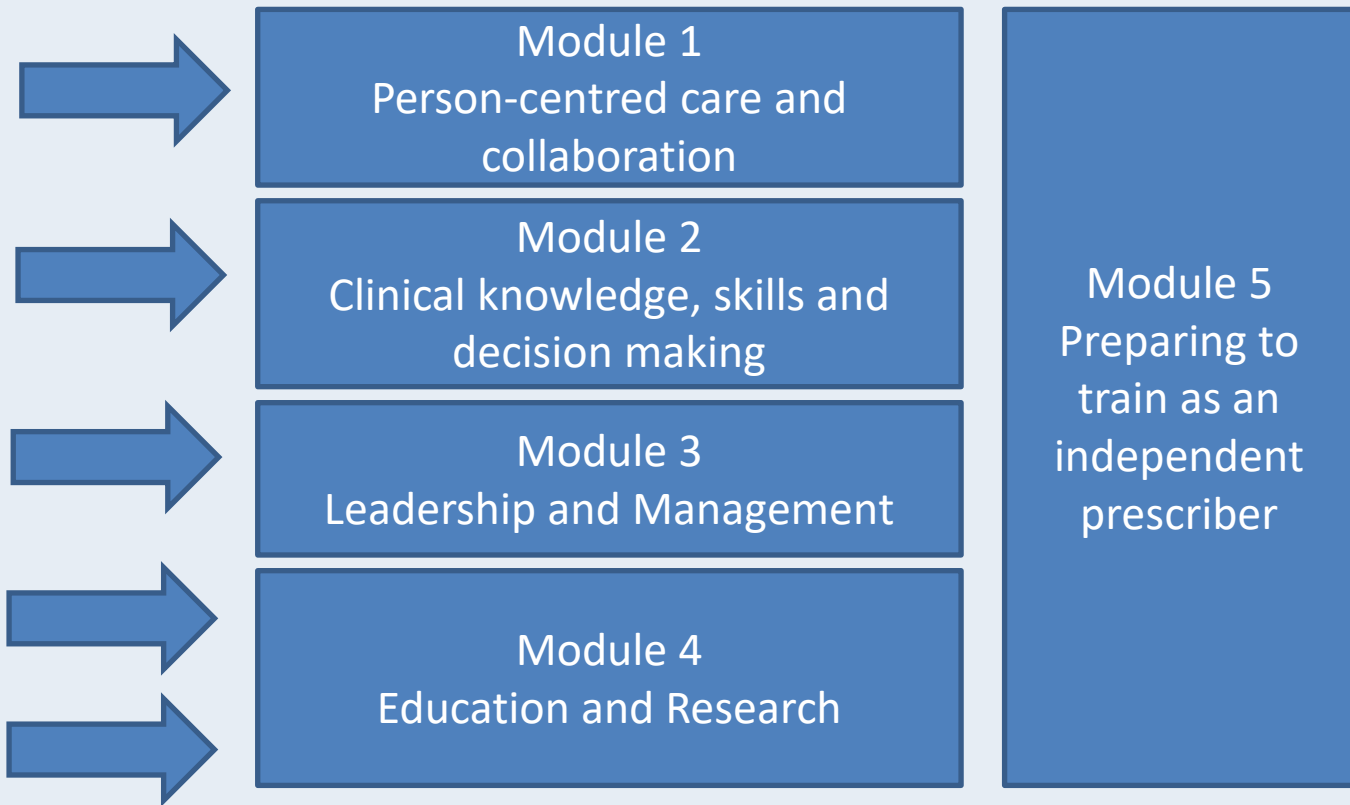

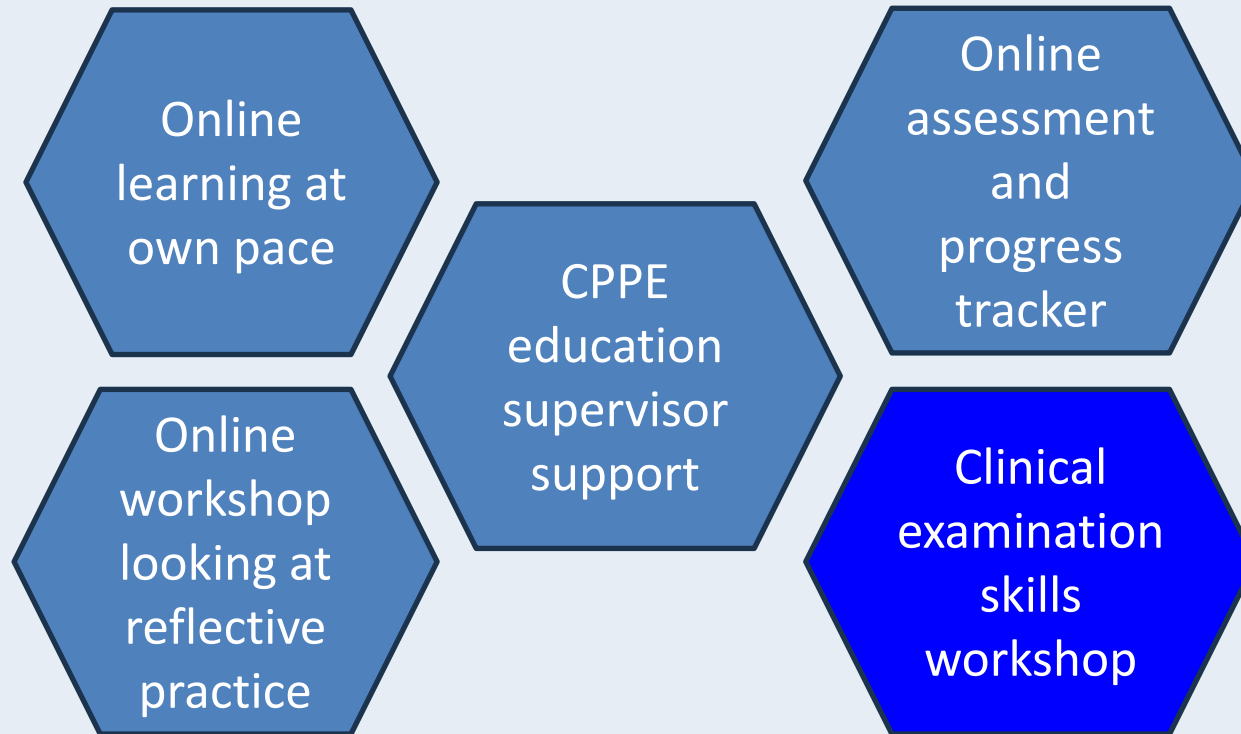

Polypharmacy e-learning



The *Introduction to appropriate polypharmacy* e-learning programme is intended for pharmacy professionals, in all areas of practice, and is designed to help increase your confidence in identifying and tackling problematic polypharmacy.

Introduction to overprescribing e-learning

This programme is for pharmacy professionals in all areas of practice.

Learners are guided to consider the impacts of overprescribing and their role in supporting people to consider alternatives to medicines where appropriate.



Fundamentals of structured medication review

E-course coming in February 2025.



This programme aims to equip pharmacy professionals with the knowledge, skills and behaviours needed to begin undertaking person-centred structured medication reviews.

Valproate: the hard conversations


